Day 1 – Thursday May 5, 2016

- 7:50 Welcome - *INACEP Lindsay Weaver MD Education Director*
- 8:00 – 9:00 "OB Emergencies" *Jay Kaplan MD FACEP*
Upon completion of this lecture, participants will understand the physiology of pregnancy and how it differs from the non-pregnant state. They will identify the different kinds of obstetrical emergencies, pre-partum, intra-partum, and post-partum; define specific techniques and approaches to deal with OB emergencies. They will have a strategy for performing a peri-mortem Cesarean birth.
- 9:00 - 10:00 "Why You Should Fear the Geriatric Abdomen" *Joe Martinez MD FACEP FAAEM*
At the end of this lecture, participants will understand the immediate threats to life of the geriatric patient with abdominal pain. They will be able to implement an algorithm for evaluating the patient suspected of having mesenteric ischemia, and understand how to detect appendicitis, which is currently, frequently missed.

Upon completion of this lecture, participants will understand the contraindications to performing an ultrasound guided nerve block. They will recognize the different types of nerve blocks and their indications for use.
- 11:10-11:40 "Anaphylaxis" *Brent Furbee MD, FACMT*
At the conclusion of this lecture, participants will understand the mechanism of anaphylaxis and angioedema, the most common triggers of anaphylaxis and the risks of an anaphylaxis occurrence. They will have a strategy for the management of anaphylaxis and angioedema.

At the conclusion of this lecture, participants will have a strategy for adjusting to a shiftwork schedule. They will recognize the pros and cons of available pharmacologic aids for shiftwork sleep disorder, and nonpharmacologic alternative methods to help adapt to night shifts.

At the end of this lecture, participants will be able to appropriately identify the indigenous and imported snakes found in Indiana. They will understand the circumstances and epidemiology of snake bites in humans, and the pathophysiology of the venomous snake bite. They will have a strategy for management of venomous snake bites.

- 2:45-3:45 "Nurses Are From Saturn, Physicians Are From Jupiter" *Jay Kaplan MD, FACEP*
The participant will understand the importance of teamwork in the creation of quality care & how to create a vision for the team, including how each individual contributes. They will develop strategies to improve teamwork and learn the algorithm for crucial conversations in order to help create accountability.

The participant will recognize what wearables are currently available and how they benefit patients and physicians. They will learn the value of future products and the additional benefits they will provide.

1:00 - 1:30 Pediatric Seizures *Elizabeth Weinstein MD, FACEP*
The participant will recognize and evaluate pediatric first non-febrile seizure and pediatric febrile seizure.

1:35 - 2:05 Community Treatment of VTE *Jeffery Kline MD, FACEP*
The participant will be able to predict which patients with pulmonary embolism have a low risk of adverse outcomes and may be eligible for discharge from the emergency department, and will understand the value of a hypercoagulable work up. They will be able to access features that increase risk of bleeding in patient with PE given fibrinolysis and know what key points to make to a patient when describing the risks and benefits of fibrinolysis.

2:10 - 3:10 Indianapolis SWAT *Andrew Stevens MD*
The participant will learn that the biggest deterrent to gun violence is training in violence prevention, which allows providers to recognize situations with potential for escalation. They will develop a strategy for preparing the emergency department for an active shooter scenario and techniques for defusing and navigating an emergency department hostage situation.

3:10 - 4:10 Stump the Professor *Emily Fitz MD*
As a result of this lecture, the participant will be able to compare and assess their own approach to colleagues' approaches for treatment of a critically ill, undifferentiated patient. Further, the participant will be able to differentiate colleagues' history taking skill in developing a differential diagnosis for focusing an appropriate work up for a critically ill IV patient.
